

HEALTH DISPARITY TRAINING PROSTATE SCHOLAR AWARD

Training prostate cancer scientists in health disparity research



The Health Disparity Training – Prostate Scholar Award reflects the **Prostate Cancer Research Program's (PCRP's)** investment in the future of prostate cancer health disparity research by training promising young individuals in the early stages of their careers. This award was designed to train predoctoral students, postdoctoral fellows, and physicians within 6 years of completing residencies. The applicant or mentor must demonstrate a connection to, or effectiveness in working with, the affected population or community. These awards require the active involvement of a mentor who is an established prostate cancer researcher from an appropriate discipline.

Depending on the level of training to be supported, funding varies from \$92,000 to \$276,000 for up to a 3-year performance period.

Proposals should emphasize health disparity, the potential of the applicant, the ability of the mentor, and the quality of the training program.
