

MULTIDISCIPLINARY POSTDOCTORAL AWARD

A multidisciplinary research training opportunity that prepares future leaders in breast cancer research.



The Multidisciplinary Postdoctoral Award is designed to identify and fund exceptionally talented recent doctoral graduates who are committed to broadening their research scope through significant, mentored training in more than one major discipline. A mentor should be identified for each of the disciplines represented within the proposed project. The disciplines must be disparate and may include, but are not limited to:

- Basic biological (including pathology);
- Clinical;
- Chemical;
- Social and behavioral;
- Engineering, physical, and mathematical; and
- Public health and health services research.

It is the responsibility of the trainee as the Principal Investigator to clearly and explicitly articulate how the proposed disciplines are distinct and how he or she will be an active participant in research involving each discipline.

Funding for this award can be requested for up to \$450,000 for direct costs for up to a 3-year performance period, plus indirect costs as appropriate. Up to \$150,000 per year in direct costs may be requested.

Pre-applications are due by April 26, 2007
Proposals are due by May 17, 2007
